MAY 4, 2010 SPECIAL DISTRICT REGULAR ELECTION CANCELLED

The Designated Election Official has officially cancelled the May 4, 2010 Special District Regular Election and declared candidates elected at the close of business on the 63rd day before the election (March 2, 2010), pursuant to Colorado Revised Statutes Section 1-5-208(1.5), as there were not more candidates for director than offices to be filled, including candidates filing affidavits of intent to be write-in candidates.

The initial cost estimate and budgeted amount for conduct of the election was \$20,540. To date, the District has spent \$1,429.80 for public notifications, *preliminary* drafting of ballots, mail-in voter ballot supplies and the like, and coordination of the election leading up to the cancellation. Additional expenses in the approximate amount of \$500 remain to complete and file the Oaths of Office for each Director with the Weld County Court and the Division of Local Government.

Terms of office for current Board members will expire after May 4, 2010. Oaths of Office will be administered to the newly elected Board members at the first regular meeting of the Board held after May 4, 2010 (May 10, 2010). Your newly elected Board members are:
