## CV Rotary's Easter Egg Hunt a huge success

Close to 750 people enjoyed Carbon Valley Rotary Club's second annual free Easter Egg Hunt April 11 at Settler's Park in Firestone. "We wanted to hold a community event that would be fun for the children, as well as educational," said Beverly Mendel, president-elect.

Children searched for more than 6,000 candy-filled eggs, as well as 150 special eggs that contained a slip to exchange for a free book.

"One of Rotary's goals is literacy, so we were excited to give out so many books this year," Mendel said.

More than 400 people went through the fire safety house set up by the Frederick Firestone Fire Protection District. The children and their parents learned about fire safety in an

inflatable house, similar to one Rotary plans to help purchase for the FFFPD.

Other activities included Life Bridge Church's hot dog and lemonade stand, JJ's Corner coffee and hot chocolate, Chic-Fil-A Easter Cow, the Carbon Valley Regional Library storytime, Creative Years' children's activities, and Diamond D Dairy samples of milk and yogurt, plus a highlight of the day: two calves for the children to pet.

"We appreciate all of the volunteers, vendors, the town of Firestone, and in particular Anderson Farms, who donated the plastic eggs and Easter toys. We were excited that the event was so successful this year, and look forward to an even bigger and better Easter Egg Hunt in 2010," Mendel said.
